
Board Meeting - February 6, 1977 - at Lucille Lagasse's home,

- President Lagasse reports the transfer of the Society's Library Collection from the home of John and Therese Pellerin to the Villa Augustina on Mast Road in Goffstown, N.H. The books are located on the second floor in the Faculty Room. Dick Fortin will check on milk case prices for use as shelf supports.
- A letter received from the Bishop with reference to usage of parish halls for a whist party- prizes needed, some are on hand - \$1.00 will be the admission charge.
- Typers are needed to record obituaries.
- Articles in newspapers could generate interest in family histories and genealogies thereby creating more memberships.
- Discussed again - Foundations and Grants - Franco-American Cultural Exchange Commission.
- Possible speakers for our next General Meeting:
 - Guy DuBay, Madewaska (charges a fee).
