Board Meeting - April 3, 1977 - at Lucille Lagasse's home, Goffstown, N.H.

President Lagasse called the meeting to order and followed her greeting with the announcement that the Library Collection had been removed from the Villa Augustina to her home into what had been a nicely finished office with a delightful view of Glenn Lake. The daytime researching by members was an inconvenience for the nuns.

She Stated there were 23 persons presently booked to date for the May trip to France.

The Treasurer reported \$206.83 cash on hand - memberships are now up to 427. The Library Collection debt has been paid for in full as of February 23, 1977. Dr. Beaudoin acknowledged the same and thanks the Society for his Life Membership. About \$800.00 was donated to the Library Collection Fund.

Some discussion on future purchases of more books; some being the remaining books completing the set of "Belle Chausse, Montgagny". Copies of the Madawaska book are available.

Guy DuBay of Madawaska shall speak on the people of that place at 1:30 P.M. at our Meeting of May 7th at St. Anselm's College. He charges a fee of \$150.00 because of the distance he must travel.

Father C.J. d'Entremont shall speak on the Acadians at 11:A.M. since he must return to Fairhaven, Mass. to attend to duties.

Coffee only will be served in the A.M. Meeting. A lunch waggon shall be on hand at noon - lunch and coffee at 3:P.M. The purchase of a coffee machine is being considered - or a rental.

Inquiry is to be made of the Pioneer Office Equipment Co. concerning a Roy-Fact Copier rental for the use of members.

The raising of the Registration Fee has been tabled but donation boxes could be displayed at the meetings to aid main speaker costs - unless the fee does become increased.


It was decided a prayer need not be said before the meetings. Research may go on until 11:A.M. at which time the door to the library room shall be closed to research but that would resume after meetings.
