Board Meeting - February 5, 1978 - at St. Anthony's Rectory Hall,
Manchester, N.H.

The February meeting was held with Jean Pellerin, President, presiding. All members of the Board were present with the exception of Rita Lippe. Meeting began at 1:30 P.M.

Minutes of the last meeting and the Treasurer's Report were read and accepted.

Our Society's trip to Quebec in June will cost each member \$97.50 for one week's stay at Auberg, Ste-Anne de Beaupre. There shall be forty persons in one bus with more buses if needed. The Berthelot Street Archives will be open to members at night and a cafeteria, run by the nuns, is near the latter place. A deposit of \$50.00 is required by each person by April 15 and the first forty people will be first served. Flyers are to be sent out in two weeks.

There is \$540.00 on hand and memberships total 637. 750 copies of The Genealogist were printed by the Lafayette Press for \$300.00.

A list of books for sale was shown to us and it was voted that letters be sent to the publishers of the books and bill us for them. Books on deaths also to be purchased.

Jeanette Dinwoodie is to write to Leonard Smith about books on Ste-Mary's Bay, Nova Scotia which he has authored and also to inquire about others, if any.

The Gale Publishing Co., Book Tower, Detroit, publishes an Encyclopedia of Organizations.

Long range goals - duplicate our books - voted and agreed upon; all to be placed on file cards with members needed as volunteers. Light stock file cards may be had at 10,000 for \$40.00 but Father Croteau is to check on a better price. Variables of names - publish a book of them in the Society's name.

Bob Bisailon is extracting the marriages in Connecticut that is to be finished in May. The Society may publish it if willing. Dick Fortin is also extracting the Laconia, N.H. marriages.

Our May meeting of two days at St. Anselm's College is to be checked out by Roger Lawrence for verification of the May 6th and 7th dates. A member of the French Genealogical Society of Connecticut is to give a short speech. Dick Fortin is to call Steven White, Moncton, New Brunswick, pertaining to his speaking at our May meeting.

Walter Letendre, a deceased member, had 10 volumes on the Letendre family containing 40,000 families and the "Memoires" as well, all of which his widow has put up for sale. Jean Pellerin is to make an offer of \$150.00 for the "Memoires". Mrs. Letendre is to call back with regard to the matter.

Jean Pellerin spoke to the Cultural Commission of Manchester as it is to be the New England group center.

Father Croteau showed us a photographed genealogical chart that measures 12x18 inches made from his full size chart that had been done entirely in black ink for sharper photographic results. We can have the same made of our charts for the cost of \$5.00. A fine size for gifts to family members and for mailing and framing.

A final motion was made and approved to limit \$200.00 in an offer by Jean Pellerin for the Letendre books.
