President Richard Fortin called the meeting to order at 6:30 P.M. The Secretary's Report was read and accepted as recorded by Louise Fluet in the absence of Jeanette Dinwoodie.

The Treasurer's Report was distributed in copies reporting: Current Available Cash - \$752.32; Savings Certificates - \$1,572.74; Life Membership Fund - \$166.45; Building Fund - \$1,551.06; Active Members - 850; Delinquent Members - 436; Total Members - 1,286.

Librarian's Report: John Pellerin reports the balance in the Library Checking Account - \$239.99 after payments on two bills. He also reports the re-embursements are regularly made by CETA. Father Croteau reports the CETA employee does her work well.

It was decided that John Hare bring certain books to the binder to be bound; and Mark Gauthier shall purchase 100 English fan charts from Goodspeed of Boston.

At a Conference of New England Governors and Premiers of Eastern Canadian Provinces, it was resolved to take further interest in genealogy and local history. Possibly some N.E. Governors will attend our fall meeting to speak with genealogists. We are asked to think of any problems encountered when writing for genealogical information in Canadian Provinces and New England.

R. Fortin reported the Quebec Government will pay the expenses of one or more of our members who attended the Rencontre Resolution Conference in Quebec last July.

No new location found ~~at~~ yet for our Society Library, but the search continues. Roger Lawrence is checking on one place.

Grant Status with ActFA: - grant request has been submitted, but no response as yet.

The Genealogist has now been issued in new and larger print type. The National Materials Development Center for French, Bedford, N.H. provide the typist for the material contained in our journal.

R. Fortin displayed the several forms researchers are obliged to fill out from the Quebec Archives.
