The meeting was called to order by Pres. Mark Gauthier at 6:45 pm. In the minutes of the Oct. 10 meeting there should be two corrections. 1. ## IV COMMITTEE REPORTS

A Library Board: The guidelines call for the President or Vice President is to be invited to and attend as member of both the Library Board and Editorial Board. Therefore, please advise them of any meetings.

E Research Dept.: Louis Valliere was excused but his total is included on the treasurers report.
