The meeting was called to order at 7:50 pm. Mr. James Lahar joined us for the Christmas party at Angelo's and left before the meeting began.

Corrections to last months meeting are page 2 V par. 1 This should be Mr. Labonte not Miss. and Par 4 Mr. Hamel said "I will put my mouth where your money is and be active in the fund raiser drive" not take the leadership role. Please correct this.

The minutes are accepted as corrected by Paul Desmarais and 2nd by Roland Marchand. All in favor.

II TREASURER REPORT

Helen Tuttle gave the treasurers report. A comment about the cost of the Genealogist being the same no matter how many copies are made is incorrect. It costs \$950. for 1300 and \$1150. for 1500 copies, therefore rounding to the neares 100 over membership and mailing should be ample so overprinting would not occur.

Bagley movers actual move was \$744. The original bill was \$1450 and after speaking to them this was an error on their part. We should have been billed \$744. plus \$220. for 4 men at 8 hrs. \$399. overtime and \$204. for the truck for a total of \$1249.

Paul Desmarais moves to pay this and Al Hamel 2nd. All were in favor as services were rendered.

Maine Chapter by laws state revenue be paid them quarterly. We suggested this be changed and they accept

that we pay them monthly or every other month. The option is deirs.

Helen TUttle would like to buy 200 like membership cards that cost \$85. Roger Lawrence moves to do this, 2nd by Terry Austin. 13 for 1 against motion passed.

III CORRESPONDING SECRETARY REPORT

Paul Desmarais is sending out application to join to those received by Research Dept. who are not members. Info kits are costly and we can cut cost down by eliminating the Genealogist.

A \$10. Research fee is primarily for members and raising that fee for non members should be discussed at the Jan. meeting under RS. A list of members would help Paul Desmarais know members.

IV COMMITTEE REPORTS

A Library Board: Bob Maurier has been given 2 keys for the outside door and 10 keys for inside, which he would like to propose that the two outside door keys belong to no one in particular but they are passed to whoever need them with two contact people here in town. The 10 others are distributed as follows: Bob Maurier, Mark Gauthier, Paul Desmarais, Louis Valliere, Helen Tuttle, Al Hamel, Andy Gingras, Terry Austin, Anne-Marie Bradley and the last one remain on the Master Key ring for Librarian on duty. Bob Maurier motioned to accept the key distribution as proposed and was 2nd by Louis Valliere. There was 12 for 1 abstain.

To remedy being locked out it has been suggested that maybe a buzzer could be dropped on the side but this and other bugs will be worked out in time.

With a lead from Al Hamel about the Chateau selling chairs, Bob went out and bought 40 at \$3.50 each for a total of \$140. A motion by Al to confirm and approve money for these chairs was made and 2nd by Paul Desmarais. We are now looking into 8 or 10 5ft. tables 30 in wide and so far we got \$50. each for brand new. If possible we'd like a better price.

Louis Valliere moves to use money from RS. to purchase the tables andwas 2nd by Anne Marie Bradley. This was unanimous. and chair

Al at this time motioned buying 3 sets of open steel shelf at \$25. a set to store extra material. This 2nd by Bob Maurier. Ayes carry.

Louis again motioned to use the \$75. from RS. and 2nd by Helen Tuttle. Ayes carried.

B Library Treasurer: Roger Lawrence says he has no printed report at this time.

C Research Dept.: Louis Valliere handed everyone two reports, one for Nov. and Dec. Mark Gauthier and Louis are working together on the description of the Guidelines for the RS/ Dept.

D Computer Comm.: Al Hamel asks "How are we doing on the membership input?" Helen informed him this is slow because of the move and material was packed so we could not work on it.

Andy Gingras proposed we offer our services to enter into the computer local repertoires or membership lines and make such data available to other members.

E Membership Committee: Helen Tuttle reports we have 35 new members and one life membership this month.

F Editorial Board: Ky Stratoti was absent but relayed the next genealogist is prepared for the publisher.

OLD BUSINESS

Mark Gauthier spoke to Roger Lawrence prior to this meeting and in order to acquire the A.C.A. collection there is a process to go through. Previous to any agreement between A.C.A. and A.C.G.S. what is there and what they claim should be there has to be checked. Mr. Lemieux insists there be a price of replacement cost of every itemthere. Some books are old and irreplace-\able able and Roger states an amount cannot be reached.

We will take care of inside ourselves.

Conference: Now that we are in a new place it is time to check and see if Holy Angel is a possibility for our conference if date is available.

We are now setting the board meetings for the beginning of the year. The dates are Jan 12, Feb 9, Mar 9 at 6:30 and these will be held at our new location St Marie's Holy Angel School. If any changes come up you will be notified.

VII open Louis Valliere praised the job well done in the move of our library.

Paul Boucher attended the Maine chapter meeting and gave a short report. There was a reminder to us that there is postage due on the mailing of our minutes. This is duly noted by Terry and will be corrected.

Motion to adjourn was made by Al Hamel and 2nd by Lucille Lagasse at 9:15. All were in favor.
