Mark Gauthier called the meeting to order at 6:35 pm Helen Tuttle moved that we accept the minutes of the last meeting as they stand and was 2nd by Anne marie Bradley. All were in favor

II TREASURER REPORT

Helen Tuttle reports that the Spring conference brought an income of \$972.40 with the expenses of \$426.79 leaving us with a profit of \$545.61. There is however an omission of \$.50 charge per person for the hall which is not included, therefore, \$52. should be added to the expenses leaving us a net profit of \$493.61. Any bills you have should be submitted to Helen for payment or reinbursement.

III CORRESPONDING SECRETARY REPORT

Paul Desmarais reports that his expenses for April and May total \$9.19 for postage on info packages. Letter stamps cannot be used on mail to Canada.

A form letter of Thank you for conations will be done by Roger Lawrence after acknowledgement of receipt by Bob Maurier. This is besides acknowledgement in the Genealogist.

V COMMITTEE REPORTS

A Library: Robert Maurier reports that new books are in and on the shelves. There is a list on the door and this will be entered in the Genealogist.

Argenteuil cards are now in the drawers next to the index. This is not complete but it's what we have for now.

Piane Nault, corner of Mason & COolidge, volunteered to have the third set of keys kept at her house. Let's hope this works out.

Again, application for a permit at the Manchester PO has been made and there is question as to our status as a non-profit organization/library. Bob is awaiting an appeal.

B Library Treasurer: Roger Lawrence presented his report on books ordered and since June more have been ordered.

Roger then motioned to send a breakdown of what he feels in justice is owed the Library Treasurer and forward that letter to Helen so she as treasurer will know and make an attempt to repay such. 2nd by Al Hamel vote unanimous

- C Editorial Board: Anne-Marie Bradley informs us that the Genealogist should go to the printer June 16th or so. This issue had to be sent out to be done as there was major disaster with the computer. The new envelopes are printed with our new logo but the stationery will not change till we have used our supply on hand. There are no inserts in this issue. It would be nice to get the issue out during the season on the cover.
- D Publication committee: Mark Gauthier reports that nothing has been cleared except what was given Roland Marchand for index to the Genealogist which is now complete up to the last issue.

There is also 150 pages R.S. index (lines done by Louis) and as soon as this is done cost will be brought up before publication.

Issue 3-8 has been brought up many times. It is felt that this should be done in it's entirety and there are 18 people waiting for this now. 9 voted for reprint but in 8 $1/2 \times 11$ size. Mark will take care of back issues.

- E Research: Louis Valliere's report should be before you and is self explanatory.
- F Membership: Helen Tuttle reports membership is a little slow this month with 32 renewals, 2 family 10 new and 5

When we Incorporated we declared ourselves as nonprofit yet we do not have a nonprofit # as far as Washington is concerned. This is not the same # needed for the I.R.S. This should be looked into.

G Computer: 20 replies to a recent computer survey conducted by Roland Marchand was received.

Roger Lawrence has 2009 parishes of repertoires in his computer. This should be distributed to people with compatible computers to ours so we (the library) could have use of this info and it could be kept up to date with incomming books.

V NEW BUSINESS

- A Ethics "forms"
 - We are out of code of ethic forms and changes should be done prior to reprint. The changes are in (1) that while representing myself as a member of said Society, I will not publish the contents of any information which may come to my attention regarding illegitimate birth records as regulated by the local Gov./State in which these records exist. Motion by Paul Desmarais to print as revised was 2nd by Anne-Marie Bradley. This was received unanimous.
- B Fall Elections
 Roger Lawrence would like it if members would come forward and let it be known if they wish to run and for what office if possible.

Committee chairman still have to submit their request to be reinstated to that possition.

- C Fall Conference
 We are in need of a committee to plan the conferences.
 Your help is certainly needed. This is our 15th anniversary.
- D Ste Marie

 The education program set up for the school needs to be clarified. There is a missunderstanding or communication problem. This should be the end for this year and next years program should have set rules.

Nothing in this agreement shall be construed to interfere with the medical or legal duties of a member of the medical or legal profession.
