Since our last board meeting, I have purchased a Pentium Computer. The installation went off without any problems. I have loaded the necessary software for viewing the Family Tree Maker CD's. I made a list of the CD's available for research on this computer. This list is on the table next to the computer. In the past, we purchased a CD of Acadian genealogies. The files supplied were GEDCOM files. The search engine on this CD was inadequate for practical searches. I have copied these 125 gedcom files to the hard drive. Luckily, the author of the CD, compiled a list of all the persons in these files. He made a file for each letter of the alphabet. These index files can be searched with a program called Notepad which comes with Windows 95. This provides a mean for the user to determine which gedcom file might be of interest to him. I therefore converted all the GEDCOM files to Family Tree Maker files for instant viewing. Most of these files have a few thousand names in them. So far we are using about 750 MB. of disk space. In the future I would like to include a few DEMO programs of genealogy software for evaluation.

Last week, we received as a donation a DeskJet 500 printer from Robert Dubois, a member. I purchased a new cartridge for it. It is reasonably fast and produces a very good copy. It is presently connected to the Pentium.

Yesterday I installed the Zip drive. It works fine. I copied some of the Family Tree Maker files that I had converted. I used up both Zip Disk that I bought with the drive. I need to copy another 50 MB. All the file equal 250 MB. I will need to purchase more Zip Disks.

I would like to resume the computer board meetings. The next meeting will be on May 19, at 6:30 p.m.







On July 31, Thursday, there will be fireworks, dedication of a large monument in memory of the Franco-Americans that settled in Lewiston.


