ACGS MEETING OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS **08 JANUARY 1998**

CALL TO ORDER A regular meeting of the Board of Directors was held on Thursday 08 January 1998 in

the library. The meeting was called to order by president Albert Hamel at 18:33.

ROLL CALL A quorum was present. Gerry Nash was excused; Bob Maurier was absent.

RECORDING

SECRETARY To be filed with corrections.

TREASURER'S **REPORT**

\$31,805 in net income in calendar 1997. Bob Paquette questioned the apparent loss in the candy and soda fund. Gerry Lalonde said that some of it is in inventory. We probably break even. Bob Paquette said that we run the compressor only for the soda we may be running a bit in the red. Consensus seems to be that we're breaking even. Mary Anna Paquette asked if PSCoNH could monitor the compressor to see how much electricity it uses. Gerry Lalonde estimated about \$150/year. Report to be filed for audit. Gerry Lalonde mentioned that he was going to add 2 subitems to item 7, viz... grants and bequests. [See attachment 1.]

VICE-PRESIDENT Bob Paquette said that he got a list of mini-workshops from Anne-Marie Perrault (Will be discussed later)

PRESIDENT

Al Hamel invited us upstairs after the meeting to see the construction progress. The contract with the state did not make today's Governor & Council meeting it should make next one.

Al Hamel said that there is no possibility of Jetté coming out on CD. The rights to the property are in the hands of the Université de Laval, which is not interested in such a project. Al Hamel also talked to them about extending the PRDH again, no interest. Parchemin: Al Hamel distributed a sample contract. He has a book on Parchemin, which he picked up in Montréal. There are various matrixes in the work. The cost is 2,500\$ CAN (about \$1,750 US). We can charge our clients appropriately to recoup the annual cost. Al Hamel doesn't think that there can be an honor system everyone who accesses and produces reports must pay. Anne-Marie Perrault asked Al Hamel if he had changed his mind about having the Research Department handle this. He has not he's still open to suggestions. Research Dept would have to be augmented. Roland Marchand said we have 2 choices do it in the library or do it at home. The consensus is that it's a good idea. Don Chaput suggested that the question be set before the Research Dept and let it come up with a plan. Roland Marchand noted that there are research sites on the Web where one can request such data. Mary Jean Colburn suggested that there be (at least) 2 people trained to do the Parchemin research. Al Hamel restated that we have a member who guarantees that we won't lose money the first year. Roger Lawrence moved that we engage Parchemin: Bob Paquette seconded; Don Chaput asked if we should wait until it's been discussed with Constance Hébert. Gerry Lalonde pointed out that we have to either engage Parchemin before setting up our infrastructure or the other way around. Al Hamel noted that Parchemin would train a couple of people. Many felt we should get going on this. Motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Acquisitions: No report.

Buildings and Grounds: Bob Paquette reported that Maurice Duval is on board works one day a week. Ray Desfosses is feeling better and will be back soon to work with Mo. Bob Paquette mentioned the "overload" on the north wall of the second floor where all the PCs are. Old bids to fix this will be resurrected. Roger Lawrence asked about janitorial services for the 3rd floor. Bob Paquette said the contract is being renegotiated. Gerry Lalonde has researched prices on the backpack vac and will purchase soon.

Computers: Roland Marchand had no formal report. FTM 4.0 has been installed. He also has an FE file for Hartford CT obituaries (over 10 years' worth). Mary Anna Paquette reported that someone has monkeyed with the research computer cannot access the HDM menu. Roland Marchand suggested taking games off the PCs. Al Hamel asked if we had sufficient printers for our PCs. Roland Marchand doesn't think we're that short on printers. Eventually we may be able to network the printers (and the PCs). Anne-Marie Perrault suggested that we could purchase another \$200 inkjet printer. We could perhaps use an A/B switchbox, but she's concerned that use of a switchbox would negate that warranty on the HP printer. Roland Marchand moved that we buy a fast b/w inkjet (price up to \$300); Anne-Marie Perrault seconded; motion carried.

Conferences: Bob Paquette said that Anne-Marie Perrault has given him a list of (previously done) mini-conferences. Question on date(s). Tentative dates are Fri/Sat 01/02 May 1998. Bob Paquette will continue to work w/Anne-Marie Perrault on this.

Editorial: Anne-Marie Perrault didn't send out a report. 75 should be ready for the printer in about 4 weeks. She is going to be overwhelmed with articles for 76.

Library: [See attachment 3.] Mary Jean Colburn reported that we have no one to open the library tomorrow any volunteers? She distributed articles on detection systems for book protection. [See attachment 4.] The Gaylord system will detect down to the floor; with the 3M, supposedly someone could "slip a book under the door". She suggested that we read these at our leisure.

Membership: Al Hamel reported that last month there were 39 new members, 124 renewals, and \$307.50 in donations to the building fund.

Publicity: [No one assigned.]

Publications: Bob Paquette reported that Pauline Côté said that Notre Dame de Victoire is ready she will bring it in tomorrow for sale. Al Hamel reported that Richard Fortin said that there is an inventory of Manchester cemeteries (a WPA project, a listing by plot) is trying to negotiate for a copy (there are only 3 in existence).

Research: [See attachment 5.] Don Chaput questioned the number of "NOs" what do they really mean? Also questioned was the "aging list" what does it mean? Gerry Lalonde said that the total income (\$4,012) agreed well with his \$4,080 figure.

Internet: Don Chaput will double up next month no report this month.

Inventory: Gerry Lalonde aid he was going to continue working with Eileen Daley on this. He suggested that we have a uniform cost per page. He also noted that we charge the same for repertoires purchased at the library as we do for those we mail out. Perhaps we should adjust the prices to recoup postage. Anne-Marie Perrault asked if there were any reason why the treasurer couldn't adjust prices on books and postage. Most felt that he should but that he work with Pauline Côté on this.

Obituary: Anne-Marie Perrault reported that work is really progressing on this lots of volunteers working on the project.

Bylaws: [See attachment 6.] Jack Stanton distributed a list of proposed amendments to the ACGS bylaws. He noted that, in Article IX, Section 1. b., there was a choice in language and that it should be up to the Board to decide which one will be presented to the general membership later this year. No decision was made at this time. Anne-Marie Perrault noted that we had a deadline (defined in the bylaws) for getting these proposed changes to the membership.

OLD BUSINESS

New vac OK; Anne-Marie Perrault will study FGS membership; Gerry Lalonde will report on VISA next month; Mary Jean Colburn reported on 2 different lenses for the Dukane readers. Gerry Lalonde asked about us getting an 800 number for accepting VISA orders; Bob Paquette will research; Mary Anna Paquette said we don't need the 800 number, rather that we should let the buyer pay for the phone call.

NEW BUSINESS

Last meeting Al Hamel mentioned a meeting he was going to have on 18 Dec 1997 re bettering our Web site. Ron Niquette had a conflict and couldn't make it. Al Hamel held the meeting anyway but no one came. He later met with Ron Niquette and Pauline Cusson to discuss this. Ron Niquette said that he could tack some of our stuff onto his homepage. Roland Marchand asked if Ron Niquette would be willing to update this on a continuing basis. Sam Harris would be interested in participating. Al Hamel said that the next meeting would be on 09 February 1998 (tentative). Don Chaput asked who decides what gets sold by the Society. There appears not to be one. The form Don Chaput was questioning was one that someone had donated to the Society. Most seemed to feel that there should be some degree of quality control on what is sold by the Society. Al Hamel suggested that there be a review board to do this. He will set up.

Gerry Lalonde moved that Al Hamel (the new president) and Gerry Lalonde (the new treasurer) be authorized to sign checks for the account with the Bank of Montréal (replacing the former president (Anne-Marie Perrault) and treasurer (Don Chaput)); Anne-Marie Perrault seconded; motion carried.

Meeting adjourned at 20:31. Next meeting at the library on Thursday, 12 February 1998 at 18:30.


- 1. Discussed collection development and establishing a formal policy and committee. Samples of policies will be distributed to L.B. members as soon as possible for ideas on formulating our own.

- 6. Bob M. gave us an update on what he has been buying and what he would like to get in the future.



Proposed amendments to clarify authority for excused abser ambiguity in definition of a quorum:

ARTICLE IV

OFFICERS

Section 3. Vacancies

- In the event of a vacancy occurring in the office of president, the vice-president shall become president.
- b. All other vacancies shall be filled by Board appointment.
- In the event an elected or appointed officer is absent without due cause from three meetings in a fiscal year, the position shall be declared vacant and the vacancy filled according to these bylaws. The president shall have sole authority to excuse an elected or appointed officer from a meeting.

ARTICLE V

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 2. Term of office of elected Directors

- b. <u>Vacancies</u>
 - 1) vacancies to complete a Director's term shall be filled by the Board.
 - 2) In the event that an elected or appointed Director is absent from three meetings in a fiscal year, the position shall be declared vacant, and the vacancy filled according to these bylaws. The president shall have sole authority to excuse an elected or appointed director from a meeting.

Section 4. Meetings

- a. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be called at any time and place to be determined by the president.
- b. Special meetings may be called at any time on order of the president, or on order of any three (3) officers and/or directors.
- c. Notice of regular or special meetings of the Board of Directors, stating time and place, shall be mailed or given in person to the members of the Board, not later than two weeks prior to the meeting.
- <u>d.</u> When all members of the Board are present at any meeting, any business may be transacted without prior notice.
- e. A quorum at any meeting shall be one more than half the [majority] <u>number</u> of officers and directors. An affirmative vote by a majority of those present shall be necessary to pass any resolution or to authorize any act for and by the Society.
- f. Where one person may hold two offices simultaneously, this person shall count as two for the purpose of a quorum, but such person shall be entitled to only one vote.

Proposed amendments to better define the duties of the Committee on Nomination and Elections:

ARTICLE IX

NOMINATION AND ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Section 1. Nominations

- Nominations for officers and directors shall be, at the time of the annual meeting:
 [a] 1) presented by the Committee on Nomination and Elections;
 [b] 2) made from the floor.
- b. Nominations presented by the Committee on Nomination and Elections ... shall be limited to one candidate per office OR ... may include more than one candidate per office.

Proposed amendments to make the name of the official publication the same in that publication and in the bylaws:

ARTICLE XII

OFFICIAL PUBLICATION

Section 1. Title

THE <u>AMERICAN-CANADIAN</u> GENEALOGIST shall be the official journal of this Society.

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP AND DUES

Section 1. Eligibility

- a. Regular membership is open to any person, upon submission of application for membership, agreement to the ACGS ethics, and payment of dues.
- b. There shall be eight (8) classes of membership:
 - 1) Individual member (regular).
 - 2) <u>Family member:</u> The first person in family shall pay regular dues and each individual additional person from the same household shall pay 50% of the individual membership dues.
 - a) only the full-payment member shall receive <u>The American-Canadian</u> <u>Genealogist</u> and other correspondence.
 - b) all members shall have equal voting rights.
 - 3) <u>Lifetime member:</u> shall be fifteen (15) times the annual membership dues.
 - 4) <u>Life-Associate member</u>: the first lifetime member in a family shall pay lifetime dues, and each additional person from the same household shall pay 50% of the lifetime dues:
 - a) only the full-paying member shall receive <u>The American-Canadian</u> <u>Genealogist</u> and other correspondence.
 - b) All members shall have equal voting rights.
 - 5) <u>Institution membership:</u> institution membership shall be twice the individual membership dues; only <u>one</u> delegated member of said institution shall be a voting member.
 - 6) <u>Sponsor:</u> Annual membership as a Sponsor shall be ten (10) times individual membership dues.

- 7) <u>Patron:</u> Annual membership as a Patron shall be twenty-five (25) times individual membership.
- 8) <u>Benefactor:</u> Annual membership as a Benefactor shall be fifty (50) times individual membership.

Proposed amendment to clarify the fact that ARTICLE VII has no function at this time:
