# ACGS MEETING OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS 12 MARCH 1998

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u> A regular meeting of the Board of Directors was held on Thursday 12 March 1998 in the

library. The meeting was called to order by president Albert Hamel at 18:33.

ROLL CALL A quorum was present. Gerry Nash and Jack Stanton were excused.

**RECORDING** 

**SECRETARY** [Not discussed.]

**TREASURER'S** 

**REPORT** Report to be filed for audit. [See attachment 1.]

**PRESIDENT** All Hamel opened the meeting by saying that he wished to cover the first four, very

important items on the agenda and then accomplish the rest of the agenda if time permitted. He termed these items critical and said they had to be resolved. Before addressing these items, however, he wanted all those present to take a walk through

the building to see what's been done and what hasn't.

He noted that the first and third items on the agenda are intertwined. He further noted that Mary Anna Paquette and our carrier have determined that we are covered, however. [See attachment 2.] Al Hamel went on to say that there also exists other liability, such as board members taking action which later may be challenged as not proper management of the society's resources .... on that we are not covered. We could be held liable individually. Mary Anna Paquette said that we should consider adding volunteers to our policy as insureds. She said there would usually be no cost associated with this type of endorsement. Al Hamel asked if any board members objected to us

doing that .... there were no objections.

Al Hamel asked for the board's feeling on purchase of "other liability" coverage. Anne-Marie Perrault noted that, in her experience with other societies, she feels that we are not personally liable. Roland Marchand asked if there was a way that we could get a legal opinion on this. Gerry Lalonde said that he spoke to our agent (a Dick Martin) who said that incidences of suits brought in similar situations are so rare that he feels the coverage is unnecessary. Gerry Lalonde said a \$1,000,000 policy would cost \$815 per year. Al Hamel then asked, based upon these previous discussions, do we wish to explore the possibility of retaining a lawyer? Names brought up included the Wadleigh law firm and Jim Normand. The board agreed to have Al Hamel contact Jim Normand to see if he would be willing to do this or to recommend someone who would.

Al Hamel then shifted to items 2 and 3. He said that an inspection of the carpeting job done on the second floor revealed that it was a "disaster" .... that it was not properly glued. The third floor was equally poor. The floor covering people we've spoken with come up with a common solution: throw away the third floor carpeting; salvage what we can from the second floor for the third floor; and buy carpet tiles for the second floor. Advantage to tiles would be that they could be replaced individually as they wear. Al Hamel had a preliminary estimate of at least \$8,000. Gerry Lalonde thinks it will be closer to \$10,000 to \$12,000.

Regarding the current contractor's remaining work, Al Hamel's strategy is to lay low on the carpet at first, get the contractor to fix things that haven't yet been done (janitor's closet, etc.), and then tell him to take the (third floor) carpet out. Al Hamel then suggested that those present walk through the building with the 19 February 1998 memo on a previous walk through in hand [See attachment 3.], compare, and make comments. All could return and talk about it. [The walk then began.]

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After the walk the board was individually polled to see if there were any disagreements with the comments on the 19 Feb memo. There were none. Mary Jean Colburn moved that we authorize Al Hamel to contact the 2 contractors with whom he has been dealing, get prices on floor covering, and set a date for installation; Don Chaput seconded and asked if we should put a cap on the price. There was considerable discussion as to whether a cap should be set .... general feeling was that it (the job) has to be done, so let's do it. There was also discussion as to whether we should push to have it done before the spring conference; general feeling was that we let it take the time that is needed. Motion carried; Jack Stanton abstained as he had just arrived. Al Hamel then began discussion on point #4, the Web page. Al Hamel had met with Ron Niquette at PC Authority. Al Hamel has also talked with Dick Eastman re price for a professional Web page. Al Hamel can get one done for about \$800. There was talk about graphics to dress up the page. Also to get a domain name. Some company can do for \$500 - \$2,000 up front and a \$35/month maintenance fee. Lots of talk about value of professionally designed page vs. a "home-made" one. Anne-Marie Perrault noted that Bob Neveux has developed a slide presentation on PowerPoint, based upon our trifold. Al Hamel asked if we should get crackin' .... soon. Most, especially Anne-Marie Perrault said yes. We could have various links for different requests ..... membership, research, Parchemin, etc. Mary Anna Paquette asked if we could make changes ourselves or would the request have to go to the "creator". Al Hamel pointed out that we can do either, but the choice is ours ..... package or piecemeal. All seem to be in favor; Bob Maurier likes the idea but advises fiscal caution. Gerry Lalonde said that we have \$18K in the checking account. Mary Anna Paquette moved that we buy the Web package; Bob Paquette seconded: motion carried.

Anne-Marie Perrault suggested that the "scheduler" do exactly that .... schedule .... set one up and expect that those asked will show up at the appointed time. Gerry Lalonde asked if we have ever considered offering free membership to librarians. Mary Anna Paquette said we have. Mary Jean Colburn said that we need 8 people per week .... 32 would make it once a month .... we have 26. Don Chaput noted that, some time ago, we had said that

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someone on the Board of Directors should have the responsibility for volunteers .... what's happened to that idea? It was noted that we have been collecting data on members who might be interested in volunteering .... but we don't use the data. Evening time slots are the most difficult to fill. Al Hamel asked Anne-Marie Perrault to put a pitch in the American-Canadian Genealogist. Anne-Marie Perrault said she would put in whatever the library people design.

Here's some info that may help to give you an idea of the difference between General Liability and D&O Liability.

Mary Anna Paquette

Directors' & Officers' Liability

===========

This insurance, also known as D&O coverage, protects board members for types of claims which are not covered by General liability and Professional liability. These types of claims include wrongful termination, discrimination, sexual harassment, and failure to promote.

No two D&O policies are alike, and a close examination of the terms and conditions is very important. All policies, however, are written on a claims made basis, and all incidents that may lead to a claim must be reported during the policy term.

The important thing to know about the basic D&O policy is that minus any enhancing endorsements, the Directors and Officers are the only insureds. The organization, its employees, volunteers, etc., are not covered by the policy. While, as in most D&O policies, coverage is for "wrongful acts" defined as errors and omissions, statements and misstatements, and negligence, it is the exclusionary language that takes away coverage for any typical non-profit exposures. Libel, slander, copyright infringement and plagiarism are examples of exposures specifically excluded by the basic D&O form.

Key Features of the D&O Policy

Indemnifies Directors & Officers of companies against suits alleging negligence, mismanagement or misstatement in their role as Ds and Os. It is an "all-risk" coverage form, i.e. it covers all suits except those specifically excluded. While this is a benefit to the insured, important exclusions and conditions do apply.

It pays for legal expenses in defending Ds & Os in addition to damages or settlement expenses paid to the plaintiff(s). Endorsements are available to add coverage for suits alleging wrongful employment practices by Ds, Os, company managers. Endorsements are also available to name the corporate entity as an insured under the policy.

Commercial General Liability

Claims for bodily injury, property damage, personal injury (libel, slander, defamation of character) and products liability are covered by Commercial General Liability insurance. The Named Insured should be the nonprofit agency, and its volunteers should be included as well. When the Named Insured on the General Liability policy is a corporation, employees and Board Members are automatically covered.

Coverage is normally written with minimum limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 annual aggregate.

The policy usually provides \$50,000 of Fire Damage Liability insurance. This pays for damage caused by the nonprofit-tenant to the portion of the building rented or occupied by the nonprofit. Fire damage caused by the nonprofit itself to the rest of the building would be paid for under Property Damage Liability coverage.

The policy also normally provides \$5,000 of Medical Payments coverage. This is "no fault" coverage, paying for medical bills of the injured person regardless of the nonprofit agency's negligence.
