ACGS **MEETING OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS** 09 APRIL 1998

CALL TO ORDER A regular meeting of the Board of Directors was held on Thursday 09 April 1998 in the library. The meeting was called to order by president Albert Hamel at 18:35.

ROLL CALL

A quorum was present. Mary Jean Colburn and Jack Stanton were excused; Roger Lawrence and Gerry Nash were absent.

RECORDING **SECRETARY**

Corrections were offered to the president's report and the buildings & grounds' report. To be filed with corrections.

TREASURER'S **REPORT**

Gerry Lalonde noted that there was nothing unusual. We had to pay for the ACG, and so ended up the month in the red in net income. We were, however, \$10,000 in the black in February. The net income on the balance sheet (\$9,596.30) shows our income year to date. Don Chaput had a question on item 17.2 (supplies). Gerry Lalonde admitted that it was unusually high. He then enumerated the individual expenses and it became evident that several usual expenses all came due in this time period. There was a question on item 18.5 (building maintenance and repair). Gerry Lalonde explained that this was high because of the change of maintenance personnel we had been a little behind in our payments. Bob Maurier asked where he could find what was spent for books. Gerry Lalonde said he was working on that. He was waiting until we have Excel at the library (he has it at home). Al Hamel called attention to item 5.2 (Parchemin). This represents the first dollars that have come in to offset our cost for Parchemin. Gerry Lalonde noted that, since the board elected to go to a leased copier rather than having one of our own, our income from copiers has dropped by \$2,000 but our expenses have also dropped by \$2,000 on supplies and we saved \$700 on maintenance. That move has proved to be a good one. Bob Maurier asked about our current assets (in checking/savings); isn't \$27,000 unusually high? Does it include some money that we borrowed to fix the upstairs rooms? Gerry Lalonde said that about \$5,000 of the building fund does represent borrowed money. Report to be filed for audit. [See attachment 1.]

VICE PRESIDENT Bob Paquette noted that the cancellation of the workshops seems to have been a good move as we're still not finished with the renovations. Al Hamel reported on a (water) leak in the building. We shall get someone to look at it.

PRESIDENT

Al Hamel then turned to a discussion of the building renovations. He had tried to contact Mr Clegg, but found that he (Mr Clegg) was ill, recovering from surgery. He has spoken to Gerry Nash about this. He reported on contacts with people who have come in to look at the rug. Gerry Lalonde said that Professional Carpet Restretchers, Inc. (of Manchester) had looked at the carpet and said that restretching it will not work. PCR has given him 3 prices for carpets one at \$6.99/yard, one at \$9.00/yard, and another at \$10.27/yard. If we choose the \$6.99 one and move the furniture, PCR will do the second floor for \$7,300. If PCR has to move the furniture, add \$2,500. As far as the third floor is concerned, PCR will lay new carpet for \$3.75/yard (labor). (This assumes that the present carpet will have been removed.) If carpet removed from the second floor is used, the installation price goes to \$3.00/yard. The whole job (second and third floor and assuming we move the furniture) can be done for \$9,821.85. There was discussion about closing for a week to get the job done. Mary Anna Paquette said that she thought it would be worth it to have PCR move the furniture. Many agreed, but

cautioned that it shouldn't include moving the books. The subject of carpet tile came up; Gerry Lalonde said that PCR carries it, but it's \$32/yard (\$8/square). General consensus was that we go with the \$9/yard one. Gerry Lalonde said that he would be more comfortable if he had one more quote. **Don Chaput moved** that, whatever the package is, we include the carpet layer moving the furniture; **Anne-Marie Perrault seconded**; **motion carried**.

Al Hamel then turned to the subject of the web page. He had a draft of our proposed page. Ron Niquette had a major hand in designing it. It's mostly text, rather than graphics.

Al Hamel has talked to (Atty) Jim Normand relative to legal help for ACGS. He has agreed to serve as our legal counsel. It can be done either as a retainer or on a fee per hour basis. Jim Normand does not recommend a retainer. He would charge us 60% of what he charges other clients. Al Hamel also spoke to him about insurance coverage for officers and directors; Jim Normand does not recommend it. Regarding the question of volunteers, Gerry Lalonde said that he had spoken to Dick Martin who will check on it but feels that, as long as the volunteers are acting as "employees" of the Society, they should be covered he will check it further.

Al Hamel noted that, on 25 March, we had a visit from the Deputy Secretary for Francophone Affairs (France). Al Hamel said that he was quite impressed with the library.

We need to buy another PC for use by the research department. Roland Marchand moved that we purchase one from a local firm, not to exceed \$1,000; Gerry Lalonde seconded; motion carried. Al Hamel noted that we should have a policy which governs what goes on our PCs. [See attachment 3.]

Guidelines: Anne-Marie Perrault had nothing new to report.

OLD BUSINESS

[See agenda.] Al Hamel spoke about a domain name for ACGS. He noted that "acgs.com" is taken,. He has put a hold on "acgs.org" and "acgs.net". He noted that the prices have gone down from \$100 for the first 2 years and \$50/year thereafter to \$70 for the first 2 years and \$35/year thereafter.

NEW BUSINESS

Al Hamel said that St Anthony's parish is celebrating their centennial. One of our members (a Chapdelaine) is working on a parish history. Al Hamel asked if we might offer to do a couple of lines of old families in the parish.

Jack Stanton announced that he would not be available for the May meeting; Mary Anna Paquette agreed to sub.

Mr Hamel

I have read your punch list and offer the following:

1. The biggest concern is the 3rd floor carpeting. I had great concerns using this carpet since it was I who had removed it from its original location and knew it was 3 different pile heights and colors. I had explained to Gerry Nash it would look terrible and would be impossible to hide the seams. I was told to do it anyway. The burn holes etc were in the carpet. We used the best of what was there, supplied by you. I said then and reiterate now I take no responsibility for the outcome. I cannot remove it at my expense nor can I make it look any better. Sufficient warnings were given as to the likely results. I did as asked.

2. Patch prep and paint:

The patches previously done by others were left. I had said I would patch any new holes and paint. At no time did I say nor was I requested to remove old patches and re-patch.

- 3. Hardware needed on bathroom partitions was not part of my contract nor were mirrors.
- 4. Floor tiles need to be cleaned and waxed. Any new floor must be stripped of factory finish and a new finish put on. This was not in our contract. Cleaning of the used carpet was added after the fact.
- 5. Originally the mail room was not part of the contract. We were approached to remove the sink and counter which we did.
- 6. The plugs on the walls plugging the old plumbing was accepted at the time they were completed. The statement " its only for storage" was used. The plugs are put in the pipe where the first joint is.
- 7. The toilets and sinks etc. were left at the request of Jerry Nash for your future use.

We did more than required by the contract. The amount of lighting on the 3rd floor far exceeds the original 26.2 lamp fixtures requested. We moved ALL the furniture from the 3rd floor not just the files and racks. We repaired the heating pipes broken by one of your volunteers. We removed a full dumpster load of materials from the 1rd floor as well as half a load of carpet which was worse than the carpet actually used. We replaced many switches and outlet covers which were missing when we started. We followed the direction given to us by those who were your representatives. I have no problem tiling the two remaining rooms and some of the other things on the list. I do however wonder if we will be paid the remaining amount of the contract if we did. I cannot and will not take responsibility for the decisions made by Jerry Nash to use the used carpet. We tried very hard to go above and beyond in light of the fact we knew ACGS had limited funds. We did not profit from this job. If I am assured we will receive the remainder of the contract money I will be happy to do as I stated above. If it is the intention of ACGS to hold us hostage for the carpet and old patches I will cut the losses here. We did as asked and much more. I do not appreciate being blamed for things which I never agreed to do nor for things which I warned were incorrect but told to do anyway.
