#### **ACGS MEETING OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS 10 SEPTEMBER 1998**

CALL TO ORDER A regular meeting of the Board of Directors was held on Thursday 10 September 1998 in the library. The meeting was called to order by president Albert Hamel at 18:30.

#### **ROLL CALL**

A quorum was present. Mary Anna Paquette, Gerry Nash, Roger Lawrence, and Sam Harris were excused. Pauline Cusson and Richard Fortin were also in attendance.

#### **RECORDING SECRETARY**

Anne-Marie Perrault questioned why specific corrections were not noted in the minutes. In response to this, Don Chaput asked if minutes could be posted on the bulletin board. Jack Stanton said he would do this in the future. Anne-Marie Perrault asked that, under New Business, a sentence be added that states that "librarians were asked not to ask for membership cards". Anne-Marie Perrault thanked Jack Stanton for his services. Minutes to be filed.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

Good month. \$8,000 in dues collected. Library income was \$1,400 .... usually around \$800. Don Chaput guestioned item 4.9. Gerry Lalonde said it's for Amos. Don Chaput questioned item 16.9 .... it's for the canvas bags for the Conference .... it will be covered. Report to be filed for audit. [See attachment 1.]

**VICE PRESIDENT** Bob Paquette reported that the new phone system has been installed. Any problems, see him. We can now page 3rd floor from 2nd floor.

#### **PRESIDENT**

Al Hamel thanked all members of the Board, and members who had headed committees, for their services during this past year. He also particularly thanked those going off the Board .... Bob Paquette, Jack Stanton, Don Chaput, and Gerry Nash.

Al Hamel also noted that we have been asked to provide parking for the (Bakersville) schoolteachers. In return, the city will be taking care of the snow removal .... should save us about \$3,000 per year. We will have to have a minor contract for hand snow removal (front walk, etc.).

He reported that re-keying would cost us about \$900. Allsafe Lock Inc. will do the job. Keys will not be able to be duplicated. Keys will cost \$5.50. Two keys for the State; 5 master keys; about 40 total. Should we ask for a \$5 deposit per key? All seemed to agree. Don Chaput seems to recall that the pushbutton (keypad) system was cheaper .... for 2 doors. He questioned the need for re-keying. Bob Paquette doesn't think that there is a key that cannot be duplicated. Regarding the pushbutton type, Bob Maurier said that there are electrical and mechanical versions. Pauline Cusson said that there could be a conflict between pushbuttons and the buzzer system. Jack Stanton read the item on keys from the July minutes .... no motion had been offered. Gerry Lalonde suggested that we further look into the keypad (pushbutton) system. We should look at keypads for the outer doors only first and then for all of them.

The 61 CDs from LDS are here. We still have the problem of security of these. The PRDH CDs (usable on a network) will cost about \$5,000 .... must protect these also. The jukebox solution would cost us about \$2,600. We only have a single license for the LDS ones. Al Hamel noted that there would be an increase in data available on CDs, so it would be worthwhile to purchase a jukebox system (preferably an expandable one).

10 September 1998

Roland Marchand doesn't think that the LDS CDs require a jukebox just yet. He suggests that, for the PRDH CDs, we use 2 PCs with unopenable CD drives. Mary Jean Colburn showed a catalog of, among other things, a CD jukebox .... even a 600 CD one. She offered that the Board visit her office to see their jukebox system. Al Hamel suggested that the library board discuss alternatives and bring them to the computer committee.

**Computers**: Roland Marchand said that we have an HP DeskJet that no longer works. He also noted that we had 386 die on us. He reported that we have 5 486s in progress (He been working with Joe Trumbull). One will be used for the LDS system. We need a graphics printer. Anne-Marie Perrault offered to donate a laser printer.

Conferences: Pauline Cusson reported that we now have the following registrations: Full 81, Saturday 73, Friday evening 34, Banquet 13. Break even point would have been around 250 .... 154 are paying the bulk of the expenses. We had an \$8,100 food minimum .... we need about 50 more attendees. Pauline Cusson asked if we were going to donate a copy of Jetté as a door prize. We shall. Al Hamel said that Lucille Lagassé had donated a \$300 globe. She has also donated a new French-English dictionary. We could give the door prizes at the banquet, at workshops, at the annual meeting. No need to be present to win. Let's do it at the banquet. We also have gift certificates from Belmont (Hall) and a copy of Ultimate Family Tree. Program books (about 36 pages) are at the printer. Al Hamel has been talking to Norman Robert (Parchemin) who seems to be reluctant to come to the Conference. Perhaps we could offer to pay him mileage. Gerry Lalonde offered to house M. Robert. Al Hamel asked if there were a precedent for granting an outgoing president a life membership. All Board of Directors members indicated no and no one wished to institute the practice.



Editorial Board Meeting was held 8 SEP 1998, at 2 PM, in the 3rd floor office

area. Present were Gerald Lalonde and Anne-Marie Perrault.

#### Topics discused included:

1. Sale of packages of ACGenealogists in multiples of 25 rather than 50.

the future, issues will be packaged and sold in multiples that correspond

the Surname Index, those specific issues to be determined in the near future

(Example: Issues 1 through 18 will be sold with the first Surname Index. Issues 19 through XX will be packaged with the second Surname Index. The third

package will consist of the first issue published in the year where we began

to include the Surname Index at the end of the year. We will continue to sell

individual issues as we have done in the past.

Gerry Lalonde feels strongly that we should continue to reprint past issues,

as stocks become depleted. I do not have strong feelings about that but I also

believe that this is not necessarily the Editor's concern.

2. Improved distribution of ACGenealogist costs: Beginning in 1999, RS Department, Publications and Conferences will be billed for the colored insert

pages, rather than having these costs posted to the journal.

3. Number of Pages, and other methods to reduce the cost of our publication:

Sometime during the last presidency of Roger Lawrence, the Board of Directors

approved a maximum of 60 pages each issue of ACGenealogist. I have felt that

this was an average over the year, because we do have issues with less than 60

pages, and the yearly issue which contains the surname index contains closer

to 80 pages.

Gerry has visited the printer and the mailer to discuss ways of

costs. Mailings to Europe will no longer be sent air mail, which the mailer

had been doing, but certainly not at our request. Mailings to Canada must continue to be first class. Choice of paper weight were discussed wth the printer, but changes would not decrease costs.

The bottom line is that we will continue as we have been and hope that the

Board of Directors continues to recognize the value of ACGenealogist in attracting members and in keeping members, long after their own genealogy has

been completed.
