AMERICAN-CANADIAN GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY MEETING OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS JANUARY 11, 1999

Call to Order

President Al Hamel opened the meeting at 6:30 p.m. A quorum was present.

The meeting began with a tour of the upstairs conference room to review the extent of the damage done by vandals.

Recording Secretary's Report

The Recording Secretary presented a written report of the December 10, 1998

meeting. Suggested changes: Change the name Cantin to Quintin on page two, under President's Report; change the name from Hamel to Hebert on page 5, Research.

Constance Hebert made a motion to accept the minutes as corrected; Craig Donais seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report - Gerry Lalond

Mr. Lalond presented his year-end financial report; indicating that the Society ended the year with a good cash position. See attached report.

Mr. Lalond indicated that although there were major repairs to the building which had increased the value of the property, \$4,700. of the repairs were charged to maintenance expense.

Mr. Lalond presented a 26-page itemized report for anyone to review. Mr. Lalond also requested whether the Board wanted to hire an outside auditor to audit the books. After some discussion, the board indicated that since Mr. Lalond was bonded that an internal audit would be done. Some discussion was given to the fact that if the Society sought grants, there may possibly be a requirement that an outside audit would be necessary, but the Board decided that that issue would be faced if it became necessary.

Roger Lawrence made a motion that the books be reviewed by internal audit; Pauly Labbe seconded the motion. Motion carried.

With the motion made and carried, the need for volunteers to do the internal audit was indicated. Craig Donais and Constance Hebert volunteered to help with the internal audit.

Gerry Lalond indicated that the candy/snack income loss which was being experienced is no longer a problem, with the new box for collecting the money in place.

Mr. Lalond asked for comments on the financial report which he presented the previous month. Discussion about the membership drive brought about the following motion:

Anne Marie Perrault made a motion to accept Mr. Lalond's membership drive resolution as presented in the December 1998 package. Sam Harris seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Vice-President's Report - Roland Marchand

Mr. Marchand's report was given by President Hamel. He reported that the public address system had been purchased and would be installed as soon as possible.

President's Report - Al Hamel

The Board having toured the upstairs conference room, President Hamel opened the matter for discussion regarding the extent of follow up to see whether some of the repair funds could be recouped.

The President indicated that no police report had yet been prepared by the officer who came to the building, but that he would pursue this matter and get a written report. After some discussion, it was agreed that the insurance company would be called to file a claim. Everyone agreed that the insurance company would be the best approach since they could then subrogate the claim, if feasible, and pursue the young vandals who created the damage. All agreed that the purpose of the insurance claim was not to protect the vandals, but to be able to clean up the mess as soon as possible.

President Hamel introduced Mr. Paul Lagasse, of Merrimack, a current member, who has volunteered to help the Society with writing grant requests. Mr. Lagasse presented his background to the Board for consideration. The subject of a grant for an elevator was discussed, with an indication that the estimated cost would be between \$100,000 to \$120,000.

Not only would a grant be prepared for the elevator to meet ADA standards, but there was some discussion of other grant requests for areas of need, which might include: Broderbund software, CD Rom protection, etc.

Considerations which Mr. Lagasse pointed out were that the Society owned the building; that 501-(C)(3) status papers would be necessary; a list of the directors and their addresses, a copy of the bylaws, our financial statement, and the estimates received from the various vendors for implementation of the elevator shaft and elevator would have to be presented as part of the grant request. Mr. Lagasse then indicated that he would have to do some research and contact the proper offices to see where the grants might be available. Mr. Lalond indicated that he had received a current listing of the available grants.

Mr. Lalond indicated that the first thing necessary would be for the building inspector to rule on where the elevator could be placed. He indicated that he had an appointment scheduled for the inspector to tour the building and that he would handle that aspect of the project. Mr. Lalonde volunteered to work with Mr. Lagasse on this

project.

Corresponding Secretary - Mary Anna Paquette

Written reports for December 1998 was presented for review by the board. See attached reports.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Acquisitions - Robert Maurier

Mr. Maurier presented a list of new books which were purchased for the Library and a list of rebound books. He also indicated that he had purchased vital statistics material from Philip Lessard, a member, who prepared statistics for Somersworth, NH; Berwick, ME; and Rollinsford, NH.

Mr. Maurier indicated that there was a meeting of the Acquisitions Committee in December, but a meeting had not been scheduled for January as yet.

Buildings & Grounds - Gerald Lalond

A status report on the shading of the windows was given and it was decided that the effects of the shading would be reviewed and a decision whether to do all the windows would be made at a later date. Mr. Lalond indicated that there are 76 windows, and to do all of them would cost approximately \$1,900. The vendor has given him a price of \$25./window.

A list of those who have entry codes and keys to the building was issued and distributed by Mr. Lalond.

Computers - Roland Marchand

President Hamel reported for Mr. Marchand. He indicated that the PRDH has arrived and is loaded in the Pentium upstairs. He also indicated the need for the purchase of new hard drives to use the program downstairs to make better use of the investment into PRDH. He indicated that five hard drives should be purchased at approximately \$100. each. It was also noted that the motherboard needed to be updated and a cost estimate should be acquired. Sam Harris is to look into the use of

the Pentium downstairs, and see whether the system can handle the PRDH.

Anne-Marie Perrault inquired as to the location of the Office 97 program disk. She could not locate it in the Library. A search will be made to find it.

It was suggested that there be a sign-out or inventory system set up for tracking the Society's program disks.

Conferences

Pauline Cusson reported on the New England Regional Genealogical Society's participation in the National Genealogical Society's Conference. She shared with the Board some of the agenda list which she had received. She indicated that the NE Regional Genealogical Society would host trips and tours during the Conference, but that National would choose all speakers. Discussion about the trips and tours indicated that it might be wise to have the tours include Concord's Vital Statistics Bureau. The Conference is to be held on May 31 through June 4, 2000, in Providence, Rhode Island, at the Civic Center.

Ms. Cusson also indicated that \$150. seed money was needed. A partial outline of requirements for the Society was indicated:

- 1. Each society that participates has to provide advanced publicity in their journal or newsletter.
- 2. Provide a list of individual mailing labels to forward the brochures to the membership;
- 3. Volunteers to work at the conference for 15 hours; the 15 hours to be split among the volunteers.
 - 4. Preparing and setting up exhibits, if participating;
- 5. Must apply for permission to sell material because of Rhode Island's sales tax requirements;
 - 6. Estimated the fee for the workshop at \$100.

Other requirements to be presented at a later date.

Pauline Cusson is to continue to attend the planning meetings and keep the Board advised of their progress. Ms. Cusson indicated that some notice to the membership could be given by including an article on the conference in the next

Spring publication of the Genealogist and agreed to write same.

Anne-Marie Perrault distributed a proposal for the Spring Mini Conference, requesting that some subjects be eliminated from the list generated at the committee meeting on January 4, 1999. She also asked for volunteers to help with the conference.

The arrangements for open house were discussed. Also discussed were inducements for new members to join.

Editorial - Anne-Marie Perrault

A written report was presented by Anne-Marie Perrault. See attached report.

Library - Mary Jean Colburn

The Librarian's report was presented. See attached report.

The subject of members' work product being displayed in the front lobby of the library was brought up for discussion. Mr. Lawrence indicated that offerings of this type enhanced the society, while others took offense that personal items were exhibited for personal profit. The consensus was that this privilege should be for every member, and not just for one person. It was indicated that the Library Board would not rule on this matter, and it was presented to the Board of Directors for review. A new display area location was discussed, but because of the vandalism, it was decided that leaving things downstairs in an unlocked area was not wise at the present time. It was agreed that all items for sale should be related to genealogy. President Hamel is to speak with Mrs. Mary Jean Colburn about this matter.

The Library's atmosphere was discussed and it was generally agreed that the Society's library is unique in that discussions and congeniality among its participants was necessary to promote mutual aid for those using the Library. The usual rule of silence does not apply in our Library in order to promote a "team" approach to helping researchers.

Bulletin Board

Pending installation.

Membership - Judy Arsenault

No membership report was presented.

Publicity

Ms. Anne-Marie Perrault indicated that the business cards have been printed and will be delivered shortly. The cards have directions and a map on the back. President Hamel indicated that everyone should carry trifolds and name cards to hand out to prospective members.

There was a general discussion as to where information could be disseminated to garner more interest in the Society's work.

Mr. Hamel reminded the Board that the Smithsonian Institute was going to be highlighting the State of New Hampshire in either June or July of 1999, and that ACGS may want to have a presence and that volunteers should be considering whether they will attend.

President Hamel indicated that he would be meeting with the French Consulate in Boston regarding the Festival de L'Ete Indien, and again, ACGS might want to participate. With these upcoming activities, he indicated that a lot of publicity could be generated for the Society.

President Hamel brought to the Board's attention that a new Manchester Historical Center might be locating in the Millyard Complex and that the Society should contact them to see how we could help them and make them aware of the Society's contribution to the community.

Publications - Pauline G. Cote

A written report was presented by Pauline G. Cote. See attached report.

Research - Constance Hebert

A written report was presented by Constance Hebert. See attached report. Mrs. Hebert indicated that it was a slow month of December, but that January was already busy. She also indicated that requests for Parchemin are very limited and requests are mostly by mail. Discussion ensued regarding the availability of Parchemin on a regular schedule in the Library at a certain time and a certain location.

The amount of time it takes to do translation work was brought to everyone's attention and the cost of which is minimal compared to the amount of time dedicated

to this duty. Roger Lawrence was asked if he would do Parchemin translations in the future.

Ms. Anne-Marie Perrault brought up the fact that some people inquiring about the timing of Parchemin requests were told that it would take two to three months to respond to a query. She indicated that this information had been given by a volunteer librarian at some time. A discussion ensued about the proper information to be given out by the volunteers when they work at the front desk.

Roger Lawrence indicated that there was a team working in New York at the present time doing research.

Internet - Al Hamel

President Hamel indicated that two domain names had been purchased for sites on the net, at the cost of \$238. The duplication is to avoid the sale of the name to anyone else. He also indicated that he had personally paid for two domain names and there is a problem with the payment. The payment being researched by his credit card company. He has reserved acgs.com and acgs.net as names.

Obituary Report

Anne-Marie Perrault indicated that the obituary project is inactive at the present time.

Old Business:

Conflict of Interest issue - Mr. Hamel explained to the board that he had contacted the Attorney General's office on this subject. The matter had been resolved by filing a copy of the Board's minutes indicating outlining the conflict of interest policy, together with the individual board members' declarations, with the Attorney General's Office.
