CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY STATEMENT

Any possible conflict of interest on the part of any member of the Board, officer or employee of the Corporation, shall be disclosed in writing to the Board and made a matter of record through an annual procedure and also when the interest involves a specific issue before the Board.

Where the transaction involving a board member, trustee or officer exceeds five hundred dollars (\$500) but is less than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) in a fiscal year, a two-thirds vote of the disinterested directors is required.

Where the transaction involved exceeds five thousand dollars (\$5,000) in a fiscal year, than a two-thirds vote of the disinterested directors and publication in the newspaper is required.

The minutes of the meeting shall reflect that a disclosure was made, the abstention from voting, and the actual vote itself.

Every new member of the Board will be advised of this policy upon entering the duties of his or her office, and shall sign a statement acknowledging, understanding of and agreement to this policy. The Board will comply with all requirements of New Hampshire law in this area and the New Hampshire requirements are incorporated into and made a part of this policy statement.

## Final Conference Report:

In accordance with the Guidelines for Conferences set up by the Society, here are the final details for the Activities of September 24 through 26.

Friday 24 September, Registration will be held on the 2nd Floor from 9:00 to 4:00 and volunteers are needed for this task and in accordance with the Guidelines "The Treasurer should be present and involved to take dues," also "The Membership chairperson should be present at the Registration table on the days of the conference, with an up to date membership list" without the impediment of a secret password. It's the President's responsibility to see that these officers are present to perform their assigned duties. (Please note that the \$20.00 conference fee is exactly that a one time fee, its for the total conference and it helps to defray the expenses of putting on the conference and is payable by all ACGS members including ALL Past Presidents who attend, including the Conference Chairman.) MEMBERS DO NOT HAVE TO PAY THE CONFERENCE FEE IN ORDER TO VOTE AT THE ANNUAL MEETING, a rumor which I believe was spread by a minority of nay sayers attempting to sabotage the conference.

The Conference guidelines which were given to me also provide that "The President must involve all members of the Board of Directors and Chairs. They should be highly visible on Friday evening at the library and all day Saturday. Their badges should be large and their names and jobs clearly visible. They should function as hosts and greeters at all programs. Their primary jobs is to be problem solvers."

"It is the President's responsibility to introduce the Board of Directors and Chairs at the President's welcoming meeting on Saturday morning, The directors, officers and chairs must be involved with their jobs during every part of the conference weekend."

The Friday night program from 7:00 to 9:00 PM will be an opportunity for members to meet socially and meet those speakers who are able to attend, vegetable and cheese hors d'oeuvres and liquid refreshments will be provided for that purpose. There will also be a roving musician playing to help with the atmosphere.

The Treasurer has accepted the responsibility to see that our cleaning services clears all the debris from the basement so that it can be used for the welcome reception and the area for our vendors, and he has advised me that it will be done on the 21st of September.

Vendors who want can start setting up Friday night the charge is \$10.00 a table, we have rented tables for that purpose. ACGS is of course exempted from this charge however those responsible for the selling of our publications and staffing those tables have not indicated how many tables they will need. This responsibility is up to the Appropriate committee and the President should see that they get going very soon on what their space needs will be. As General Chairman I do not intend to chase them around, if we don't sell our books, oh well it will be ACGS's loss.

Saturday 25 September, Registration will be on the 1st floor with coffee, tea, some sort of breakfast pastry available again gratis. It will also be a good time to visit the vendors who are to be set up by the opening of the doors.

Ribbon Cutting will take place at 9:00 AM at the second floor double doors on the East side, the General Chairman will be the Emcee and the actual ribbon cutting will be done by the Society President assisted by one of the Guest representatives from our fellow Societies in attendance and all Past Presidents should be there as well.

Business Meeting will begin at 9:15 in the 3rd floor auditorium presided over by the President.

The rest of the program is as listed on the program that was sent to our membership with copies available at the library. All the speakers will be introduced by the General Chairman and any of their activities prior and during the conference are under my control and any changes have to be cleared through me.

All our speakers are provided with a stipend of \$125.00 and a payment of mileage at 31 cents a mile; their rooms and meals will also be paid for a two night stay only and all meals taken at the hotel are to be put on the room bill, spouses come at the speakers expense and not paid by ACGS.

Whoever is in charge of the audiovisuals belonging to the Society should contact the General Chairman ASAP to make sure

that we use what we have before renting the needed equipment for our speakers.

Genealogical Roundtable will be held at 3:30 PM and will be Presided over by John DuLong one of our members from Michigan. In addition to ACGS, there will be representatives from our own Begin Chapter, the American French Genealogical Society, The French-Canadian Genealogical Society of Connecticut, The French-Canadian Heritage Society of Michigan, The Franco-American Genealogical Society of York County Maine, and the Vermont French-Canadian Genealogical Society, and in closing I want to make it very clear, the roundtable idea as well as the acquisition of the speakers and the program concept was solely that of the General Chairman and our perennial do-nothing bow takers had nothing to do with it.

Sunday 26, September, The library will be open for research from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM and the Raffle will be drawn. In addition to those prizes listed on the flyer, Craig Donais has advised me that AFGS has donated one of the CD's of the Red Drouins to be raffled and I will see that they are publicly thanked at the appropriate time on Saturday.

**New England Regional Consortium and NGS Conference 2000**

As indicated when I accepted the responsibility of representing the ACGS at the NERGC for Conference 2000, I was out of the State at the time of the annual meeting on June 5, 1999. I asked several times in advance if someone could take my place. No response and no representation. Consequently, I was only made aware of the August meeting a week or so beforehand.

On Saturday, August 29, 1999, I attended another planning meeting for Conference 2000. At the meeting held in July at the Providence Civic Center, they handed out the 1-sheet preliminary flyer on the conference.

Ruth Wellner, Chairman for Volunteers has resigned. The NERGC is looking for a replacement for Ruth. This is a very time-consuming chairmanship since this chairperson will need to co-ordinate all the volunteers on site for the 2 pre-conference days and the 2 conference days.

Paul Leblanc, Registration Chairman has resigned. This chairmanship needs to be filled soon if we are to have a successful conference. There is nothing more devastating for a conference of 3,000 attendees than to have under staffed and uncoordinated registration centers.

Committee Volunteers: This task is not even half fulfilled. There are 22 societies participating. One of the requirements of participation is to provide five Committee Volunteers from each society. We should have about 110 volunteers for just the pre-planning and on-site committees. Our count so far is a whopping 34.

On-site Volunteers: Each society is expected to provide 15 volunteer hours during the conference. Those volunteers for the registration tables and the vendor area **do not** need to be registered for the conference to help out on those days.

Non-registrants **will** be allowed in the vendor area during the 4 days of conference. I suspect most of the on-site volunteers will be non-registrants and local people. ACGS has two volunteers for on-site as of this writing - **Norm and Jeanne Chaunt** from the Woonsocket area. AFGS has withdrawn its participation in this conference and the Chaunts felt they could be of service to ACGS in fulfilling its commitment.

David Mishkin reported that vendor booths have ranged from \$150 - \$200 per booth for the NGS Conferences. Historically, NGS has also given 1 full registration per booth to the vendors. Conference 2000 registration is expected to be about \$150 for the two days of workshops. All meals are extra at this Conference including breakfast, lunch and dinner. Non-members of NGS pay an additional \$40 for full registration. (About the cost of one year's dues).

Conference program and registration booklets will be available in February. Each participating society is responsible for distribution of the pamphlets and promoting of the Conference. It is

acceptable to have a supply of pamphlets in our library and a notice on our web page or a reprint of the 1-page flyer in our journal to fulfill this part of our responsibilities as a participating society.

The scheduled March 27<sup>th</sup> meeting was rescheduled to March 20<sup>th</sup> with only two weeks notice. I did not have time to change my schedule; therefore ACGS was not represented at that meeting. The delegates voted to assess an additional \$159 to the participating societies to cover the pre-conference expenses that have been incurred for travel and representation at the 1999 conference in Richmond, Virginia. We had two delegates who were able to meet with the host Society in Virginia. The most difficult link in the chain for a successful conference is the number of volunteers. They claim that it is far better to have 15 volunteers giving 1-2 hours each, than 3 volunteers giving 5 hours each. It still is not known if Richmond was a financial success.

On Wednesday night before conference opening, there will be a special Society Fair for the participating societies to promote their society. No selling allowed, but you can take all the orders you want. **Does ACGS want to participate?**

The Consortium's profit will come primarily from the 'early' registrations. We will receive \$3 per 'early' registrant and \$2 per person who registers at the conference. We **could** gross \$9000. Each participating society could earn around \$400. However, if a society does not fulfill any one of the three major requirements – promotion/publicity; committee volunteers; on-site volunteers – they forfeit their share of the proceeds. There is no free ride for this conference. Each society who participates, shares equally in the burden of pre-planning and on-site responsibilities for success in order to share equally in the proceeds. If a participating society has not paid the pre-conference assessment of \$159, it will be withheld from the profit distribution check. As far as I know, ACGS has not paid their share yet.

As noted above, the ACGS has only two volunteers of record. If that is the extent of our commitment to this Conference, **then I believe the Board of Directors needs to rethink how badly they want to participate in the National conference. Will we get very much exposure? Probably not. If we stay in this Conference, do we want to offer a one-day bus trip from Providence to Manchester on Tuesday, May 29?**

The next planning meeting is scheduled for November 6, 1999 in Sudbury, Massachusetts at the Fairbanks Senior Center. I think it is only fair to the rest of the participants that ACGS decide whether to stay in or withdraw. Should the Board decide to stay in this Conference, and then there are many more details that need to be discussed. We are way behind in our fulfillment of responsibilities to the other New England Regional Conference participating societies.
