Notes of the meeting with the people of the Father Leo Begin Chapter of the ACGS.

Topics that were covered:

1. The structure of the Father Begin Chapter.

This chapter was formed according to the provision of Article VI, Section 2, of the ACGS by-laws as approved on October 7, 1989. (In my research so far I did not find a copy of the Chapter by-laws. A copy will be provided.)

2. The insurance coverage of the Chapter

The Chapter has maintained and is presently covered by insurance of the library inventory and for potential liability claims (a copy was given to Gerry. Gerry has looked into to a canopy coverage to include both Manchester and Auburn at a very nominal fee, provided that we each maintain our separate coverage. The canopy would cover for potential liability claims that would exceed the individual policies.)

- 3. At present the Chapter pays Maine Sales Tax on their purchases. (A copy of the IRS document that has granted the ACGS tax exempt status was left with the Chapter personnel, in order to allow them to apply a tax exempt document form the State of Maine)
- 4. At present most of the Chapter's income is from the portion of the dues that are sent to the Chapter as provided for by Article VI, Section 4b. (the 40% of the dues paid by members that reside within the State of Maine)
- 5. Some copies of past financial reports were provided to Gerry and in the future copies will be forwarded as they are prepared.
- 6. At present the physical location is located in the former Edward Little High School building, which is still owned by the city. The Chapter is in the process of arriving at a fee that they will donate to the city for the use of the building. Exact amount not yet establish. They are free tenants at this time.
- 7. Discussed also was the price that they are presently paying to the Manchester office for supplies, repertoires and other costs. Since the Chapter is part of the ACGS all charges to them should be at cost to the ACGS (plus freight, if applicable), (consideration should also be given to supplying the publications of ACGS at no fee)
- 8. The President R. Lawrence has agreed to sent to the Chapter a copy of his publications and possible related materials.

- 9. Also discussed was there potential short term plans. At present they are not making any book purchased until the have arrived at firm rental cost.
- 10. Copies of the prior ACGS publications will be supplied and copies of future ACGS publications will automatically forwarded.
- 11. In view of the fact that the Chapter and Manchester are only one organization, consideration should be definitely be given to supplying them with a copy of the PRDH. It has been discussed at past Board meeting that there is very little being presently done for the distant members of the ACGS, this would allow at least some 225 (est.) members with access to that system. Our present contract provides Manchester with 5 copies of the PRDH information, it appears that one could be supplied to these distant members without effecting the Manchester operation.
- 12. An invitation was extended to the Chapter members to attend the Manchester monthly Board meetings.
- 13. A closer connection has to be established between the Chapter and Manchester.

Required to implement these proposals:

A. If it cannot be found that in fact a motion was made to create the Chapter as provided for in Article VI, Section 1. A motion will have to be made.

Proposed motion: A motion is hereby being made to officially record the Father Leo Begin Chapter of the ACGS That has been in existence. (This is needed in the case that an insurance claim is required in the future. The Chapter policy was issued to the 'ACGS Father Leo Begin Chapter' Therefore we have to make sure that such an organization exists

- B. To put in effect the billing procedure, the following motion has to be made"

 A motion is made that in the future all charges made to the Father Leo Begin Chapter are made at the cost to the ACGS (plus freight is applicable)
- C. To provide the Chapter with ACGS publication at no cost since the Chapter is the ACGS:

 A motion is made to sent to the Chapter Father Leo Begin one (1) copy of each of the repertoires that have been published by the ACGS (in Manchester) and that the Chapter does not have a copy in it's inventory and to sent (1) copy of each future publication(s). The Father Leo Begin Chapter will also supply the ACGS in Manchester with a copy of all of their publications. (The Chapter is presently in the process of doing the cemeteries in and around Lewiston and of doing the obituaries of that area)
- D. To provide the Chapter with a copy of the PHDH:

A motion is made to either use the copy that is on the laptop computer, (if that is acceptable to Mr. A. Hamel since he uses that copy for promotional seminars) or one of the other copies and sent it to the

Father Leo Begin Chapter for the use of the State Of Maine members or of other members or guests of the ACGS that visit the Auburn Chapter location. (That would provide for our members with an location for their use in doing there research)

- E. To establish a closer communication with the Father Begin Chapter by inviting their Board Members to the Manchester Board meetings. And in turn to have some of the Manchester Directors attend at least one meeting in Auburn annually.
- F. To make available to the Father Leo Begin Chapter any duplicate copies, before contacting any other organization(s).

Also probably required, after I have reviewed the Chapter by-laws is that the chapter Director might have to be identified by the tile of "Chapter Father Leo Begin Director" so as not to conflict with the ACGS directors. The officer of the chapter should also be identified as "Chapter Father Leo Begin President, Chapter Father Leo Begin Vice-President, Chapter Father Leo Begin Treasurer" and so forth for all the positions. That would clearly identify their limitations and present no conflict with anyone doing business with the Chapter. As it presently exists the Officers and Directors are "...of the ACGS", thereby indicating to outsiders that they act fro the ACGS in general rather then for the Chapter only.

UPDATE

August 9, 2000

As of today I have not received any information from the Father Leo Begin Chapter.

I have started to review the minutes of the ACGS Board meetings for the past years. I have many more to review before I can ascertain just what action was taken when the chapter was formed.

I will continue my research and make a report at a future meeting.
