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

Hi everyone,

Pauline Cote's report to Board of Directors has prompted me to get going with establishing a routine for Editorial Board meetings. Some of you in the list of addressees are included for informational reasons. If you don't feel a need to participate in any or all of the EdBd meetings that's o.k. too. If any of you have something you want discussed by this board, please let me know in advance of the meeting.

I'm thinking about picking one Saturday morning a month at about 9:00 a.m. at the library. If some of you are serving on another board such as acquisitions or library board that might meet on a Saturday let me know - maybe we can run the meets in tandem so that we all only have to give up one Sat. a.m. a month. The Ed.Bd. does not need to meet every month either. For sure we should meet once before an issue goes to the printer and one quick meeting to critique each issue after it has hit the stands, so to speak.

Believe it or not, we have made some progress:

Robin Sanscartier has agreed to do the Queries. Don Chaput resigned. Some of the material comes through the RS department and is good 'query material' or Forum news for the journal.

Mel Surette continues to provide excellent material for the Acadian section and we determined that Anne-Marie probably intended to do a 2-part article for the Acadians in Mass. We are working on getting the second part worked into issue #86. There was a glitch in this article on pp. 122 and 123. I think I know how it happened, but I'm not sure if it needs to be point out in the next issue. He has also already submitted a feature article for this issue and an article [translation from a French journal] on midwifery in France. I'm waiting for permission from the editor of the French journal to print the translation.

Diane Nault-Lauziere is going to scan other periodicals/journals for excerpts for the section on 'From Other Publications' and has some old newspaper articles that might be of interest to our readers. Sounds great. The excerpts will probably just consist of the title, author, publication/date, French or English, and subject of the article that she thinks our readers should know about.

Constance Hebert has already indexed the first 3 issues of 2000. If I can do as well as her with #86 as it gets solidified, one of my goals will be met - an index of names appearing on each page of each issue in this Volume of the Genealogist included in the last issue of the year [No. 4]. Thanks

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
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again Constance. I hope we can stay on target with this detail.

This of course means that the 4th issue of the year will be on the light side for text but on the heavy side for # of pages. Hopefully, no more than twenty pages. These index pages will not include the member lists at the end of each issue so it may not be as lengthy as I think it will be.

Muriel and I have been discussing some of the confusion re: Queries and RS Queries etc. etc. on the web site. We need to talk about that some more and would appreciate everyone's input on this item.

Julie Smith and I have worked out some details for getting the label database and new member list to me for each issue. Both need to be at the very end of the cycle before it goes to the printer, to be sure the newest members are included in the new member list AND in the mailing.

I think we need to talk about the mailing - I guess it's going into week 4 and some people on the acgs talk list still don't have their journal! I've e-mailed Gerry Lalonde to check the # of surplus books that come from the mail handlers. That will give us a better idea if a large block of names may have been dropped from the list in the transfer via e-mail or some other misfortune!!!

Bob has recruited Norma Boyce to join the Editorial team to help in any way she can. Norma works and lives in Manchester. I'm sure we'll be able to use an extra pair of hands and eyes to keep our journal 'top notch.'

My target date to get issue #86 to the printer is December 4. That will give him 4 weeks to print and the mailers will not have to be concerned about getting the journals into the Holiday flow.

My goal is to get an issue to the printer in the middle month of each calendar quarter in 2001 for distribution to the members at least by the 3rd month of each quarter. In 2002, perhaps we can strive to get a delivery date to the members by the 2nd month of each quarter.

I've read some of the material that Anne-Marie had in her files. Some of it looks like she was going to include it in some upcoming issues. If anyone can enlighten me, please do so. Lucy Consentino's daughter did an interesting article about genealogy, our library, and some interviews with Frank Binett et. al. that I think you might find refreshing for the journal. I really need all of your counsel on this one.
