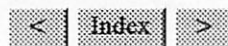

Lowell, founded Cott Distributing; 94

LOWELL -- Eva S. Nyman, 94, the co-founder and former treasurer of the Cott Distributing Co. of Lowell, which she founded with her husband, died of natural causes yesterday morning, Dec. 2, at Willow Manor Nursing Home. She was the wife of Alec Nyman, with whom she celebrated their 54th anniversary in August.

Born in Haverhill, she graduated with honors from Haverhill High School. She was an executive secretary to the president of the Holtz Shoe Manufacturing Co. in Haverhill until her marriage in 1936.

After the sale of the company, she became a volunteer at Community Teamwork in Lowell. When she was 72, she was offered a salaried position at CTI as a bookkeeper and worked there three days a week until she retired at age 75.

Mrs. Nyman was a voracious reader.

In addition to her husband, survivors include a son and daughter-in-law, Philip S. and Joan Nyman of Andover; two grandchildren, Jane Folpe of New York City and Andrew Folpe of Atlanta; a son-in-law, Herbert Folpe of New York City; three nephews, Chief Justice Samuel Zoll of Salem, Michael Zoll of Martha's Vineyard and Steven Gilboard of Dracut; a great-granddaughter, Leah Folpe; and several grandnieces and nephews.

She was also the mother of the late Susan Nyman Folpe, who died of cancer in 1988.

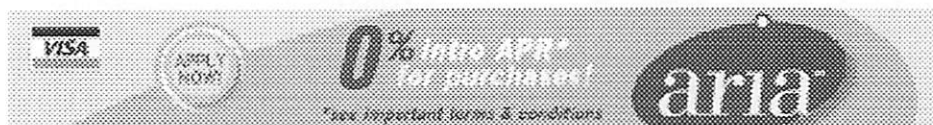

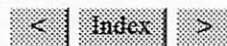
