### Congressman Sununu

President Jussaume signed the privacy release at the end of last month's meeting, and that, along with information taken from our website on what the ACGS was all about, was sent to Congressman Sununu. I haven't heard anything back, probably because of Christmas and the transition to Senator.

### **Manchester CIP Grant**

Gerry Lalonde called and e-mailed me last Friday night (Jan. 3) to tell me that he heard from Ed Girard who heard it from "an alderman" that something was wrong with the paperwork recently submitted for the Manchester CIP grant. Gerry had no further specifics. Gerry reminded me he was leaving for Hawaii on Monday. I called and e-mailed Ed Girard Friday night, but received no response. Monday morning I called Ed again. Ed told me that he heard it from Alderman Hank Thibault, but had no further specifics. He suggested I call Sam Marento at the Manchester Community Development Dept. He said he would be calling to let me know when the presentation before the Mayor and Alderman was scheduled. I called Ed Girard back and let him know the results of my phone conversation with Sam Marento, and requested that he, too, call me if anything came up.

## Commitment Letter from Otis Elevator

I have placed a phone call, and am waiting for a call back, from the Portland, ME office of Otis Elevator to inquire about the proper procedure to get Otis' donation of the installation labor in writing. This way, when we apply for additional grants, or meet with city officials, Otis' contribution can be included in funds "pledged". This will help our cause.


When they got to St Ann what did they find
