Herb will contact the city to find out where the pipe leads to and what if anything the city can do for us. No action can be taken until Herb researches the matter further. Herb emphasized the importance of removing anything and everything off the floor on the first floor as a precautionary measure.

Herb also reported that a flush valve is broken on one of the toilets on the 3rd floor ladies room. He requested that we notify the Gaelic group that uses the upstairs that they need to notify us of any problems immediately so it can be taken care of. Herb said the repair could be made for approximately \$380.00

Motion made by Gerry Lalond to appropriate up to \$400.00 to replace the flush valve in the 3rd floor restroom. Seconded by Ann Gleason. Motion carried

Herb suggested we try to renegotiate our contract with the church regarding the parking lot. Discussion ensued. Gerry Lalond read parts of the contract and the matter was tabled for further review.

Bob Paquette reported the need for 2 more computers as the ones we are now using for the Drouin are always occupied and that presents a problem for members wanting to use PRDH. Discussion followed.

Motion made by Julie Smith for the purchase of 2 new Dell computers with 17-inch monitors, CRT, for a maximum of \$1,000.00 including shipping. Seconded by Lorette Leaf. Motion carried.



The big issue this month has again been e-mail or lack thereof. Gerry Savard has been forwarding E-mail to his address, so we haven't been totally without. A disconnect order was placed with AT&T on November 17 and still has not been completed. The problem arises in that Verizon cannot do the necessary provisioning to get us their DSL service until AT&T is totally off; this is by law. AT&T had 15 days to complete the disconnect. We are past that. I have made numerous calls to both Verizon and AT&T and have spent at least 4 or 5 hours on the phone trying to get this completed to no avail. On Tuesday, I made a call to the NH PUC and placed a complaint against AT&T. To be continued.

The Drouin collection continues to be a big draw and the four computers equipped to view the collection are very busy. In some cases folks wanting to access PRDH or some of the other sources have to wait. It may be time to consider buying two more computers to put out on the floor. These would be dedicated strictly to the Drouin collection. I will have an estimate of the cost to be presented at the board meeting. I say estimate as the cost varies almost daily with different promotions.

The problem arises in that Verizon cannot do the necessary provisioning to get us their DSL service until AT&T is totally offt this is by law. AT&T had days to complete the disconnect. We are past that I have made numerous calls to both Verizon and AT&T and have spen; at least 4 or 5 hours on the phone trying to get this completed to no avail. On Tuesday, I made a call to the NH PUC and placed a complaint against AT&T. To be continued.

The Dronin collection continues to be a big draw and the four computers equipped to view the collection are very basy. It some cases folks winning to necess PRDH or some of the other sources have to writ, it may be time to consider buying on more computers to put out on the floor. These would be dedicated strictly to the Drouin collection. I will have an estimate of the cost to be presented at the board meeting. I say estimate as the cost varies almost daily with different promotions.
