### Minutes of the Board Meeting May 18, 2008

### REPORT OF OFFICERS

#### Recording Secretary:

 Motion to defer April minutes until the June meeting. Motion by Constance Hebert; seconded by Jackie Watson. Motion carried.

### Treasurer's Report:

- After talking with Norma Boyce who will do our audit for 2007, Pauline Cusson explained that the only time the net income on the Balance Sheet equals the net income on the current month's Income & Expenses is in January. Net Income on the Balance Sheet is an accumulation of net income/loss from the beginning of the year.
- Norma will do the audit as soon as Pauline gets the 3 monthly folders that Bob Labelle was working on.
- Pauline will also look into whether or not we need to carry the -0- balance Note Payable on the Balance Sheet anymore.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

The following reports were submitted electronically.

- Membership Committee
  - O Jackie Watson and Pauline Cusson will cull the Exchange List, first for the Canadian exchanges, and remove those from which we do not receive an exchange journal of equal value to ours.
  - We will try doing the mailing of the Genealogist to all foreign members & exchanges from here. Jim Gaudet can deliver to the P.O. for mailing in small batches thereby saving the mail-house handling costs.
- The Genealogist due to the lateness of the Spring issue and the need to get the Summer issue out well in advance of the Conference, Pauline Cusson suggested we combine these two issues in order to include the full conference registration form and at the same time save a few thousand dollars in printing and postage. Julie Smith made a motion to combine these two issues this one time. Anne Gleason seconded. Motion carried.
- Research: Report distributed.
- Website:

### Publications, Inventory and Shipping:

- Discussed the price for St. Joseph Repertoire in Greenwich, NY. Our printing/binding cost is \$25.53 for each book; our 'other costs' to produce the repertoire was estimated to be about \$25 more. In order to sell them more quickly, the Board discussed a sell price of \$75. This is a 600 page, 1-vol. hard bound book of Baptisms, Marriages, Burials. Julie Smith made the motion to set the price at \$75 and Constance Hebert seconded. Motion carried.
- The same process was discussed regarding Resurrection Church in Nashua. Jim Gaudet made the motion that we set the sale price of this 300-page volume at \$45. Julie Smith seconded. Motion carried.

### **Acquisitions**

• Larry Autotte submitted an electronic report that derived from recent e-mails with Mr. Paul **Desfosses** who will be here on Friday, May 23 to pick up an order of our repertoires for the Société de Genealogie des Cantons de l'Est [Genealogical Society of Eastern Townships] in Sherbrooke. Mr. Desfosses proposed that we go through their list of books for sale and he could bring the order with him next week.

Once Larry compared their list of reps for sale to what we had in our holdings already, it turned out that there were about 40 reps we did not have that contained only a few duplicates of marriages published by this society in previous years. In most cases, even if we re-purchase those marriages the new repertoires contain about 30-40 additional years of marriages. All other repertoires contain baptisms and burials most of which we lack. The estimated book purchase was abut \$1,4000. The Society offers the same books in CD format and the estimated cost would be about \$600. Bob Paquette was asked if the CDs could be loaded onto the hard drive that has the Drouin database and be made available on the Drouin computers. He thought this was quite feasible. Julie Smith made a motion to purchase all 40 +/- repertoires in CD format to be made available on several computers. Jackie Watson seconded. Motion carried.

### **Building and Grounds:**

- The elevator/chair lift has been inspected and the permit for 2008/2009 will be posted.
- A video monitoring security system has been installed. Herb Boyce was able to obtain free labor and wiring. The video equipment cost us about \$1,300 which includes 4 ultraviolet cameras. It will cost an additional \$250 for each camera we add. The Treasurer will look into getting a credit on our insurance coverage for our holdings. Constance Hebert had a list of about 6 books that have gone missing since Mary Anna Paquette became our Library Director 3 years ago. Herb has agreed to check the video on a weekly basis. Julie Smith made the motion that we keep the system. Jim Gaudet seconded. 7 voted for; 1 voted against; 2 abstained. Motion
  - The sound system in the large conference room has been fixed free of charge thanks to Herb **Bovce**.
  - Alarm system at Baker St. entrance. Herb had his son look at it. Most everything needed to
    activate it is in place. The existing keypad would need to be replaced. We would need to pay an
    annual fee for an alarm company to monitor the system; some internal work would have to be
    done to activate some motion detectors already in place, etc. etc. After much discussion the
    board decided to defer the discussion to a later date.
  - Herb presented a proposal for the electrical, lighting, and drop-ceiling work for about \$15,000. The board felt we should go through one winter with the new windows and then have KeySpan come in and do an analysis of our savings and how much more we could save if we proceed with the above mentioned work. Proposal was deferred to next Spring.

- In conjunction with the security system, a discussion ensued regarding the number of keys that have been given out and duplicated. It was suggested that we might want to clear out the keypad system numbers at have each person who needs access to the building 're-sign' up for a password. This will cull many people who no long give us volunteer service but who still have access and a key.
  - In this discussion it was also suggested that the key problem might be solved if we put another keypad at the second floor/library level similar to the one outside where the door can be monitored for entry on off hours. It could still be unlocked during regular hours of operation. Herb was asked to get us a quote for keypad/buzzer system at the second floor entry. No work is to be done without prior approval by the Board.
- The Board suggested May 15<sup>th</sup> for turning off the heat and October 15<sup>th</sup> for turning it on. This was determined to give Herb **Boyce** a starting point for each season. If the weather is arbitrary at either of these times, Herb will address the situation on an as-needed basis. Reminders will be posted in the library each season reminding people to dress accordingly.

### Conference Committee:

- Fall conference; Pauline Cusson attended a presentation by Dr. Claire Quintal at the French Library in Boston. Dr. Quintal is available on September 27<sup>th</sup> and has agreed to speak on the French Canadian presence in New England [based on her book Steeples & Smokestacks]. She was also offered the opportunity to sell and sign her book at the conference. Pauline will confirm the topic and the arrangements with Dr. Quintal. Pauline also was in touch with Walter Hickey of the National Archives. He hasn't positively accepted [may have a conflict]. He will do a presentation on the St. Albans Border Crossing registers and the treasures this collection holds for French Canadian genealogists.
- Booked; André Senecal UVM who will discuss the Champlain experience and the planned celebrations for Anniversary of the settling of the Lake Champlain region.
- Jim Gaudet is working on getting about 1,000 mechanical pencils with our emblem and tagline at a cost of about \$100 for handouts at the NERGC in April 2009 and at our own conferences.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

- Discussion regarding the Library Board's report wherein they decided to close the library for the entire weekend of 4<sup>th</sup> of July. Denis Joyal indicated he was not asked if he was planning on being here. He agreed that he could be here if we wanted to open. We will also ask for a volunteer for Saturday, July 5<sup>th</sup>. This is a time of travel and vacations where our members and visitors might expect us to be open for research. However, we will definitely be closed on Friday, July 4<sup>th</sup>.
- We have been discussing a dues increase effective January 1, 2009. Julie Smith made a motion that the Individual Membership be increased to \$35 for US residents and \$43 for foreign members [paid in US dollars]. Family will remain at \$45 for US residents and \$57 for foreign residents. Institutional will remain at \$50, and student will remain at \$15. Life membership is still 15 times the individual or Family rate. Seconded by Anne Gleason. Motion carried. Julie Smith offered to mark up any tri-folds remaining after the first of the year to reflect these changes.
- Publicity John Cooke has volunteered to do publicity for local area libraries and community
  centers when he is given information on conferences and workshops etc. etc. This would involve
  one-page flyers that we can all help with by putting them in our local libraries or community
  centers. Major publicity for our conferences will still be a joint effort with John as we build a
  newspaper contact database.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- Looking for replacement for Al and Connie Hamel to do a couple of road shows per year. no resolution yet.
- Dennis Joyal will be giving a presentation in Laconia on July 12<sup>th</sup> and of course will promote ACGS.
- ACGS is receiving a Preservation Award from the Manchester Historical Association at a
  banquet on May 22. There is one more free ticket available. Lorette Leafe cannot make it. Jim
  Gaudet left early and will be offered the ticket. If he can't make it, we will offer it to BJ Pelletier
  Shoja.
- Paul Lambert who is recovering from heart surgery felt it would be in his and our best interest if he resigned his post as a Director. Many thanks were given to him for all his service to the Society. In a final remark he wanted it recorded that he is officially donating the cash register to the Society as there was a question as to the legality of the purchase several years ago.
- June Board Meeting will be held on June 8<sup>th</sup> instead of the 15<sup>th</sup>. Muriel Normand and Pauline Cusson will be in Montreal on the NEHGS Research trip and the 15<sup>th</sup> is also Father's Day. Julie Smith made the motion to change the meeting to June 8<sup>th</sup> and Constance Hebert seconded. Motion carried.
- Jackie Watson informed the board that she has a new e-mail address: w.jackie#6@yahoo.com




Overall, we continue to experience increased web site activity each year.


